CELEBRATIONS IN SCHOOL

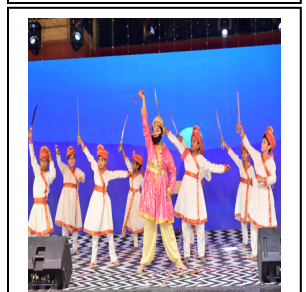
1. The first celebration of the New Year was marked by the celebration of the **76th Republic Day**. The national festival was celebrated with great zeal by the students.

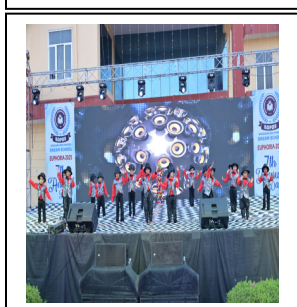

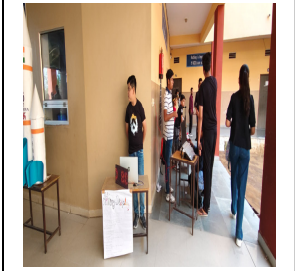

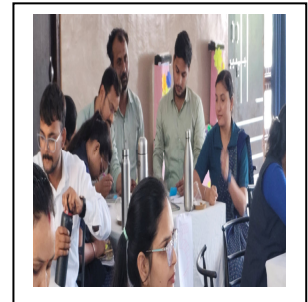
16. **From July 12, 2025 onwards**, the school started organizing the house meetings to plan for various school events and competitions.

18. On **8th August, 2025 Raksha Bandhan** was celebrated for pre-primary wing, spreading the message of sibling



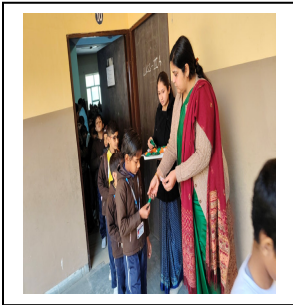


love, care and affection. Girls tied *Rakhis* to the boys and boys gifted chocolates to their friends.

the moment. An inspirational speech by the Director made the vent a memorable one.

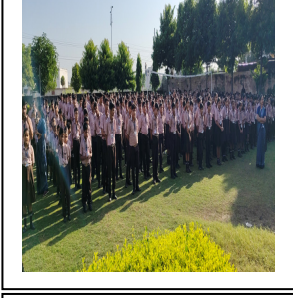

Day 3: On the conclusion day, cultural programs took place along with prize distribution.

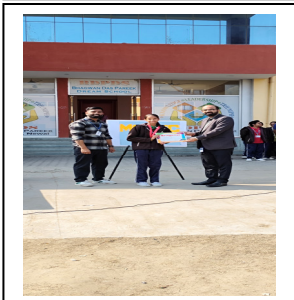
